Identified School and Community Risk Factors

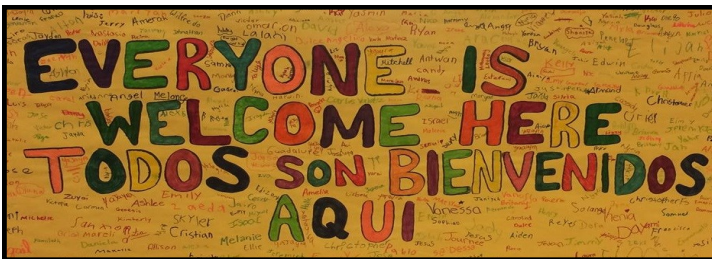
- High poverty
